Dear Families,

We hope you enjoyed visiting our 'Art Gallery' last Friday. This final week of the half term has yet again been lots of fun and very busy!

Our Year 6's have been working hard preparing for their class assembly and are looking forward to presenting their work on the 1960's to their families on Friday.

Year 5 have also been looking at this decade too, as they have been enjoying finding out about the first moon landing.



Donation to the Palma Aquarium Foundation

This initiative was motivated after visiting the facilities of the Palma Aquarium Foundation in June, where they were able to see the work carried out by researchers and volunteers in the recovery of protected species (turtles, dolphins and other marine animals).

During the activity, they were informed about how important it is to respect the marine ecosystem and to involve society as a whole in its care. A moment of reality and awareness came when we were able to see what kind of plastic materials many of these species are hooked to and we saw first-hand the damage they cause.

After the visit, the students of our school decided to start raising funds for the Foundation, raising

the amount indicated above by selling drinks to students of the school and helping with the second hand uniform sales during the months of October and November.

This type of activity, which motivates students to become involved in our society, getting actively involved and looking for realistic solutions to the level of impact they can make at this time, is part of the essence of the IB Diploma Programme and more specifically of the CAS projects (Creativity, Activity and Service) which make this profile of students people for and with society.
