Year 7 and 8 Trip to Llucmajor's Puig de Cura

On Thursday 29th February, Green Valley's Years 7 and 8 went out on a field trip to Llucmajor's Puig de Cura. The trip was designed to offer some insight on the three monastery mountain as well as the geography of the area.

We started our hike from Llucmajor, on the Camí de Gràcia, which took us past some very old stone

crosses, markers for the old road up the hill and towards the first monastery, Gràcia. We initiated ascending the mounting at 10:00 a.m. and reached the top at 12:00 noon, so our students did really well and managed to navigate the terrain and the sun with an excellent sense of humour. We also walked past a farm with some very friendly dogs and donkeys, and enjoyed some of the wild aromatic herbs that grow in the area.

Once at the top, we visited the outside of the weather station and the children enjoyed the 360 degree image of Mallorca, as well as the breathtaking view of Cabrera. We played football and had lunch. After that we went down towards the Algaida side of the mountain, which took us through some very slippery paths which our students enjoyed the most. But the best thrills came with the tunnel crossing over to the other side of the mountain, an old military facility and now just a passageway open to everyone which our children really enjoyed.

After that, it was all easy and down towards the village of Randa, one of the most beautiful in the island, where we were picked up by our bus and returned to Green Valley.
