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Message from Mr. O' Connor

Dear Parents and Friends,

Many of you are aware of the changes both political and academic that have occurred in the Spanish Ministry of Education over the last 7 months. These changes affect all schools, both international and national, private, and public as they are compulsory. Effectively, we have been asked to ensure that there is a minimum number

of lessons in Catalan and Social Studies for all students, both international and national. Until recently, Catalan and Social Studies were studied only by those students that were required to do it by the Spanish Ministry of Education. The minimum number of classes depends on the age of the students, for example, from Year 3 upwards, the minimum required are 3 Catalan classes and 1 Social Study Class. In line with the Spanish regulations, we have implemented these requirements, and effectively all students in Years 2, 5 and 8 have now followed these guidelines for the last term. Importantly, we have ensured that our GVS Curriculum has continued to include Third language.

The next step that we are required to implement is to ensure that all students from Years 2 to Year 9 follow this from September 2023. Years 10 and 11 continue with the structure that we had previously with all those students who are required to take Catalan, having to do so.

We are planning these changes into our timetables for the new school year. However, you can be reassured as we have already demonstrated with Years 2, 5, and 8, following these local obligations really enriches the students even further in our local culture. The Third Language programme continues to be an integral part of the GVS curriculum leading up to the International Baccalaureate programme.

Our Spanish Technical Director and IB Coordinator Mr. Méndez continues to guide and lead us in these changes so we can achieve an optimal learning environment and curriculum for our students.

We are pleased to report that the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) examinations have progressed smoothly. As we approach the final week of exams, we look forward to celebrating the achievements of our graduating students on May 17th at the Graduation Ceremony.

In addition, our Year 11 students continue their journey through the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) exams, which will conclude for most on June 5th. A smaller group will complete their exams on June 13th. We are excited to celebrate their accomplishments at the IGCSE Graduation on June 7th, which will be a closed event held during school hours.

We also wish to remind our Year 10 and Year 12 students to prepare diligently for their Term 3 Progress Check Tests (PCTs), and our Key Stage 3 (KS3) students to revise for their end-of-year comprehensive exams in select subjects. For the Y10 PCTs, we've made an adjustment to the

schedule. They will now begin on Monday, May 27th and finish on Friday, May 31st (inclusive).
